

Seesaw Home Learning



Currently, all parents are using the 'Seesaw FAMILY' app. This is used to view posts from teachers about what is going on in school and, more recently, to see instructions and guidance for home learning. This will continue to be used as normal.

To allow pupils to send evidence of their work to their teachers, we ask that you now download the 'Seesaw CLASS' app. This allows pupils to be more independent and receive tasks straight from the teacher.

- Each pupil is given an individual password. This will be sent to the parent. Please note this a different password than the QR code previously used to sign in to the Seesaw FAMILY app.
- Pupils can see their own journal, just like the parents can.
- They cannot see the work of other pupils (unless group work is shared by the class teacher).
- Pupils can then add to their journal to show their teacher what
 they have done. Here they can add a photo, drawing, video, file,
 note or link. Photos may be the simplest form of feedback if
 work is being completed in books. In the interest of internet
 safety, teachers must approve all posts that the students
 send.

Additional Resource being used from 1st April.

- Once they have signed in, they can see new tasks set by their teacher in the 'Activities' tab.
- They can respond to their teacher by clicking 'Add Response'.

 This gives them the same options as posting to their journal.
- Teachers will see and review work once pupils have responded.

 This should already be marked together at home when possible.

Pupil instructions

- 1. Go to https://web.seesaw.me on a computer. Or install the Seesaw Class iOS or Android app.
- 2. Tap "I'm a Student".
- 3. Type in your Home Learning code. (e.g. ABCD EFGH IJKL)
- 4. Post to your journal, respond to activities, and view class announcements.
- 5. Remember, this code is like a password. Keep it safe!

The first time pupils log in, there will be lots of likes on posts that have been sent to their profile earlier in the year. There will not be as many of these in the future!

This is simply a new way that the pupils will receive their tasks. It will not create a bigger workload for parents or pupils. It should give pupils more independence and lessen the amount of time parents spend sharing information with them.
